

Midland Driver Education Policies and Rules (Summer 2019)

Attendance

- Students must attend 30 hours (1800 minutes) of classroom instruction (State Law). Students can only miss two classes and on their third absence, they will be dropped from the course with no refund of their payment.
- Students must have 6 hours of Behind-the-Wheel instruction from a certified BTW instructor (State Law).

Driving Times

- Students must be at the school and on time for their scheduled drive times.
- Students must have their permit with them at all times (State Law). Not having their permit will result in an absence for the driving time.
- Only one missed driving time is allowed. One missed drive time results in driving with the license examiner. Students will be dropped from this course with more than one missed driving time and no refund of their payment.

Completion of the Course

- Students must average 70% or higher on their knowledge tests to pass Drivers Education.
- Students that average below 75% on their knowledge tests will need to drive with the license examiner.
- Grade will be given based on completion of 30 hours classroom instruction, 6 hours of behind-the-wheel instruction, assignment completion, and test scores.
- Certificate of completion will be signed by instructor based on driving scores and driving ability.
- Students dismissed from class for inappropriate behavior will be dropped from the class with no refund of their payment.
- Any make-up times will be held at the convenience of the instructor.

Driving with the License Examiner

- There are three ways in which a student may be forced to drive with the license examiner, and they are as follows:
 - o Student misses driving time
 - o Student average below 75% on classroom tests.
 - o Student's driving ability is lower than instructor's expectations.
