# **Administrator's Message**

The second semester of the 20-21 school year is off to a great start at the secondary! This time of year is always a busy one for us as we work our way through one school year and begin preparations for the next.

Mrs. Brokaw has been busy working with sophomore and junior students who are interested in taking Kirkwood academies next year at the Jones Regional Education Center in Monticello. The Kirkwood academies offer students the opportunity to earn both high school and college credits as a high school student. The Liberal Arts "Pick and Choose" options allow students to get a jump on liberal arts requirements for college while building study skills and knowledge necessary for college. Meanwhile, the career academies like Auto Technology, Graphic Arts, and Computer Networking allow students to explore career options and "test the waters" to see if a career truly appeals to them. Another benefit of the career academies is that some academies like Welding and Health Sciences prepare students for vital career certifications. We are excited that the 2021-22 options include the new Dental career academy.

During the month of February, we will start the registration process for the coming school year for students in grades 8-11. We will hold grade level meetings with the students to go over the course registration handbook and the process for scheduling. To ensure we get accurate information, our scheduling process involves both a paper form which requires a parent signature and an online course request through PowerSchool. We utilize the course request information to help us determine next year's schedule. We look at which courses students are requesting so we know which courses to offer, how many sections are needed, and where to position courses in the day so that as many students as possible can get into their course preferences. We encourage parents to take an active role in this process to aid students in making wise course selections that will best prepare students for an intended career pathway. We recognize that the closer students get to their senior year, the scarier this process can be, and we welcome the opportunity to work with students and parents to answer questions. Feel free to reach out for an appointment.

On a final note, we are making preparations for our students to take the Iowa State Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP). Last year, our state testing was canceled due to Covid. This year will be especially important so that we can see what learning was missed during the Covid shutdown, what learning we have recovered, and what learning we still need to address. We have scheduled the ISASP testing for the middle/high school for March 23 – April 2. We ask that families please make these two weeks a priority by ensuring your students are in attendance, are well rested, and are prepared to give their best efforts on the testing. All students in grades 3 – 11 are required to take the ISASP. All remote learners are required by the state to come into the building to take the ISASP. We will be sending out information to our remote learners as to how that testing will look and the steps we are taking to ensure your students health and well-being during the testing situation.






# 2<sup>nd</sup> grade Gum Drop Stem Challenge

# February 1-5 is National School Counseling Week Thanks to Mrs. Brokaw, Mrs. Lasack & Mrs. Hein for all they do for our Midland students!

**SENIORS** ~ **Scholarship** season is kicking into high gear! Be sure to check the scholarship binder in the office, check the scholarship webpage and watch your email for all potential scholarships that we are informed on. Be sure to give your references plenty of time to write good letters of recommendation for you and give them plenty of information about yourself including all activities you are involved in, any work experience, all volunteer info, most importantly **WATCH THOSE DEADLINES!!!** Show the HS office any letters or emails you receive showing you've been awarded a scholarship so you can be acknowledged at graduation!

- ~ FAFSA financial aid form should already be submitted!
- ~ Remember, 2nd semester grades are important and can affect your scholarship eligibility, finish STRONG!

### JUNIORS: ~ If you are considering going to college, try to schedule two college visits this spring.

- ~ Make sure your senior year includes the credits you need to meet the college entrance requirements.
- ~ Put together a resume listing your activities, volunteer experiences, academic achievements and employment.
- ~ Register if planning to take the April ACT test. April is a good time as you can retake it in fall if needed.

#### **ALL STUDENTS:**

- ~ **Investigate colleges or post-high school options** talk to your parents, counselor, relatives, friends!
- ~ Investigate careers. There is a link to various careers at www.icansucceed.org.
- ~ Finish your year strong, make S2 2020-21 your best academic semester yet!
- ~ **Discuss your future plans and dreams** with your parents, counselor, teacher when we start the 21-22 course registration process so you sign up for the right courses to set yourself up for future success.
