## Administrator's Message

Dear Midland Eagles,

There have been so many things to celebrate as of late. We had a tremendous homecoming, our elementary students are rocking some of their assessments, our FFA chapter is continuing to accomplish some amazing feats, our student body is celebrating each other and the activities they are all involved in, Joe Beckman gave a great presentation, and one absolutely amazing thing is that our students out sick at our MS/HS building have come back down.

We had a couple of scary days a couple weeks back that I know we are still trying to recover from. Students are trying to catch up, staff are trying to stay caught up and healthy, and overall we are all trying to learn from that and look at how we can improve going forward to ensure that we do all that we can to keep our school community safe and healthy, while also keeping our school doors open. With approval from the board, we have purchased HEPA filters for every classroom and office. An agreement was made with the HEPA filter company to allow our staff and community to purchase equipment at the same price as the school too. In addition to this, our school board also took action to allow our nursing/health staff to mask a student that is showing minor symptoms so that they can stay in school. We are also having our health staff work with students and families to mask at appropriate times if they are returning from being home sick, or have a family member ill at home too. Ultimately whether it is covid, the flu, strep throat, or any other illness or bug, we want to be able to keep kiddos in school and ensure that we have enough staff to make that happen, especially as we enter the time of the year known as flu and cold season.

At this time, other than the ability for nurses to require masks, our masking protocols are remaining as they have been with masking being optional. Please continue to keep an eye on our building illness numbers and data to make the best decisions possible for your family. When numbers begin to creep up we may advocate for more masking when students socially distance, but this will still be optional unless our board decides otherwise.

Thank you all for your continued help and support as we continue to navigate this new and ever changing reality.

### **ACADEMICS:**

## Remediation Day - October 18

The secondary will be having a Remediation Day for students in grades 6–12 on Monday, October 18. This is a day for students who are struggling to meet learning targets in courses to get extra assistance from teachers and staff before we move into the second half of the semester. Teachers will be meeting with students the week before to let them know if they need to attend Remediation Day. Students who are at proficiency in all learning targets in all courses will receive a "Gold Letter" indicating that they are excused for the day. Students who are not yet at proficiency in their learning targets will receive a "Purple Letter" indicating that we want them here for Remediation Day to receive additional assistance. If a student is required to come for Remediation Day and finishes all learning targets during the day, he/she is free to leave the building if they have transportation home or live in Wyoming. All students are required to sign out in the office if they are leaving the MMHS building that day.

**Parents, check your Parent PowerSchool account** on October 21<sup>st</sup> as that is the mid-point of Semester 1.

#### HALL OF FAME INDUCTIONS

Congratulations to Shirley Petersen, Kirk Park and Phil Coppess all 2021 Inductees into the Midland Hall of Fame.

Shirley Petersen taught in the Midland District for a total of 38 years (5 in Wyoming and 33 in Lost Nation). She retired from teaching in 1994 and has remained active in our community helping others in countless ways. She is 91 years young and still volunteering when needed.



She has been involved with the Zion Lutheran "Piecemakers" for 21 years, making quilts for those in need. She has been involved in the local food pantry and in serving "Sparks" kids supper for the past 9 years. She has volunteered for Community Vacation Bible School for as long as she can remember.

She says her biggest contribution to the Midland School District has been her family. Five children graduated from Midland, 5 of her 8 grandchildren are Midland grads as well. Two great grandchildren are current Midland students with 2 more in the near future.

We thank Shirley for her efforts in the Midland District for all of these years! We love to see her out helping!



**Kirk Park** came to Midland in 1974 and taught business, computers and PE over his 39 years here. He also coached football, boys' basketball, softball and golf. He became Athletic Director in 1983 and served as Dean of Students for a couple of years.

Kirk's football teams participated in the Class 1A football playoffs in 1983, 1985 and 1994. As a golf coach he has had state qualifiers two years.

Kirk is currently the boys' golf coach and officiates in both basketball and softball. He has officiated in the Iowa girls' state softball tournament for 14 years and the Iowa girls' state basketball tournament one year.

Kirk was a Class 1A Athletic Director of the Year in 2014 and was inducted into the Iowa Girls Coaches Association Softball Officials Hall of Fame in 2020. Kirk also currently mows all of the athletic fields for Midland.

Thanks for your efforts over these past 47 years Kirk, you have touched a lot of lives here!

**Phil Coppess** will be inducted at a home football game later this fall. He graduated from Oxford Junction High School in 1972. Phil was a runner! There was a runor that after track meets the bus would drop him off in Lost Nation and he would run home to OJ. Phil held 5 state individual titles in track and cross country. Phil won the Class C outdoor 2 mile run in 1971 and 1972. He won the Class E one mile and Class D 2 mile in cross country in 1971 and the indoor Class C 2 mile in 1972. He held the state indoor 2 mile record 9:56.9 and 2 mile outdoor run 9:45.1.

His love for running continued into his adult life winning the Drake Marathon and Chicago Marathon (beating Olympic champion, Frank Shorter) and the Huntsville, AL Marathon in 1981. In 1985 he was ranked #1 marathon USA runner by Track & Field News and ran the Twin Cities Marathon where he set a record that stood until 2016 at 2 hr. 10 m 5 sec. He also set course records in the Lincoln Marathon and the Winstone People's Marthon in Auckland, New Zealand. In 2014 Mr. Coppess was inducted into the Iowa Track and Cross Country Hall of Fame.

We welcome Phil to the Hall of Fame, he has shown other Midland athletes that you can stay competitive for many years and should always give your best. We hope your love of running goes on and on and on...

## What is PBIS?

PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) is a system that Midland Middle and High School has in place to increase positive behavior within the school setting. PBIS is a framework for all involved, students and staff, that will integrate behavioral interventions to enhance academic and social behavior outcomes for all students.

PBIS consists of three different intervention tiers:

- Tier 1- Universal Interventions (80-90% of students)
- Tier 2- Secondary Interventions (5-10% of students)
- Tier 3- Tertiary Interventions (1-5% of students)

Respect, Responsibility and Personal Best are the three pillars of the secondary PBIS program.

#### **EAGLE BUCKS:**

Eagle Bucks are awarded for meeting expectations and exhibiting positive behaviors. When Eagle Bucks are handed out by teachers or staff members, it is done at random and common language is used with students.

**For example:** Thank you for showing respect and picking up the paper that your classmate dropped.

We utilize <u>PBIS Rewards</u> for teachers and students to manage their Eagle Bucks. Teachers award Eagle Bucks through PBIS Rewards to specific students. Students can utilize their own login to view their balance and purchase items from the School Store.

Items purchased from the School Store through PBIS rewards are distributed after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

#### MEET OUR STAFF



Angie Sconsa is our Transition Alliance Program Coordinator at Midland Middle/High School.

She can work with any student over 14 with an IEP, 504, or suspected disability. She is a contracted employee through Iowa Vocational Rehabilitation Services.

## **COUNSELOR'S CORNER**



The counseling department secured job shadow experiences for 8 students in September.

The job shadow experiences are provided through Kirkwood's Workplace Learning Connection.

This program is available to sophomores through seniors and allows students to explore careers of interest and gain useful information about what it will take to succeed in these careers. Opportunities include careers in Ag, Engineering, Health Science, Human Services, Information Solutions, and Business.

#### **Suicide Prevention Month**

September was suicide prevention month. While the topic is scary, it's something that should be discussed so you know what to do should your friend or family member ever confront you with suicidal thoughts. In 2020 there were 536 deaths from suicide in the state of Iowa and 5 of those were from Jones county (Iowa Public Health). A message from the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline is to #BeThe1To. This includes being the one to ask how someone is doing, be there for them, keep them safe, help them to stay connected, and follow up. The number to call is 1-800-273-8255. There is also a crisis text line (text HOME to 741741) and apps such as NotOK and suicide safety plan. Your counselors, teachers, paras, and administration are all here for you no matter what. If you or a friend need help, reach out!

#### SENIOR MEETINGS

All seniors need to make an appointment with their counselor in order to discuss after high school plans. These meetings include important information like confirming credit count to graduate, important dates for ACT, FSA ID, FAFSA, and Application Day. We can also help you look at colleges of interest, answer questions about credits transferring, give tips for scholarship essays, and help schedule campus tours. Please **DO NOT** make an appointment for the same day. Also, Mrs. Schnepper is **ONLY** here on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.
