
ACT BOOT CAMP

Preschool and Kindergarten sign-up for 2023-24

The Midland District would like to have information on the number of <u>Preschool</u> and <u>Kindergarten</u> students to be enrolled next fall for the 2023-24 school year. A preschool student must be 4 years old by September 15, 2023 and a kindergarten student must be 5 years old by September 15, 2023 to attend school.

K / PK Round up is scheduled for Friday February 24, 2023.

Kindergarten Round up: 8:30 AM – 10:45 AM

Preschool Round up: 9:00 AM – 10:00 AM OR 1:00 PM – 2:00 PM

ALL STUDENTS: A new resource was brought to our attention that you all should check out!

https://www.raise.me/

This website allows students to earn "micro scholarships" for things they already have done, are doing, or will do during their high school career. They create an account and then click through the options that apply to them, such as, take science class, get an A, go on a campus visit, have a job, play football, etc. After going through choices, the site matches them with colleges around the area and assigns a dollar amount to each "task". Freshmen can sign up and earn quite a bit for doing what they would already do during high school! The counseling department will explain more during registration talks but students should take advantage of this resource now if college is in their future plans!

Registration talks will take place during February! Students should look at their Xello accounts and make adjustments to course plans ahead of time to make the process quicker!

ASVAB TESTS - In December, all 10th graders took the ASVAB test. Thanks to all of those who showed up on time and did their best! On January 23rd an interpreter shared with the students what these test scores mean and future career options for them.

Pauline Antons was a math teacher with 26 years of service to the district, once retired she served as a substitute teacher from the age of 65-92. She was also our NHS advisor, senior class sponsor and SES advisor. She received the Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching by President Reagan in 1988, which included a week in Washington DC and a \$7500 grant. The grant purchased 2 computers and supplies for the math department here at Midland. She was recognized with a Friend of Mathematics Award from the Iowa Council of Teachers of Mathematics in 1992 for soliciting funds so each senior would have a TI-81 graphing calculator to use. She received the Jones County Conservation Teacher Award in 1988 and 1993. Mrs. Antons was always happy to share her math experience and passed along her love of math to many students. She was active in her community and helped raise money for scholarships, needy families and libraries. Living on a farm she was actively involved in conservation efforts as well.

Thank you Mrs. Antons for all of your dedicated service to both our students and our community!





Gary Mohl was a student at Lost Nation where he was an outstanding basketball player (still holding records there) as well as a Division 1 basketball player at UNI. Gary was a teacher, coach, principal and mentor to students in Avoca, Lewis Central in Council Bluffs, Davenport West, Lost Nation, Danville, Calamus-Wheatland, and Midland. Throughout his educational career he had taught science and drivers education, and coached basketball and football. He was a beloved Principal here at Midland, retiring in 2000.

Gary was a humble guy who didn't like to talk about himself but would always tell anyone who would listen that no matter what you do, always be a good person in the process as that will ultimately take you furthest in life. He was very passionate and very positive in his work with students and staff. Gary passed away in August 2022 at the age of 83 so his family came to accept this award on his behalf including his wife Alice and children Gregg Mohl, Brenda Snyder, Mark Mohl, and Jody James.

Thank you Gary for the wonderful memories you created both at Lost Nation and Midland over the years!
