## 2024 Jones County Cattlemen's Scholarship

#### **Scholarship Overview**

At least one scholarship of \$1000 will be awarded to an outstanding student who is pursuing a career in agriculture. Fields of study may include, Beef Production, Ag Education, Communications, Ag Studies & Production, Ag Research or any other area involved with the agricultural industry. The purpose of this program is to identify and encourage young talented students who want to pursue a career in Agriculture as a leader in the industry.

Scholarship funds will be awarded to student after completion of their first semester of college.

The top scholarship applicant will be awarded a paid three year membership to the lowa Cattlemen's Association.

#### **Conditions of Eligibility**

Applicants must be a graduating high school senior.

Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to a career in the agricultural industry through classes, internships, or life experiences.

Points are awarded for applicant's parent(s)/guardian(s) who are member of the Jones County/Iowa Cattlemen's Association.

Applicants must be enrolled as an undergraduate student in a two or four-year institution of higher education for the entire 2024-2025 academic year. Proof of enrollment as a full-time student will be required to receive the scholarship money.

#### **Judging Procedure**

All applications received will be handled as follows: applicants names will be removed, applications will be forwarded to a cattlemen's judging committee outside of Jones County, and will be evaluated solely on the criteria outlined on the application.
