School Registration Information

All parents are required to register their students for the 2025-26 school year through your parent account in PowerSchool, please be sure to give complete updated information for all of your children. Parents should receive an email with registration information soon. *Parents of new students* please contact the office at 319-259-5340 ext 1250 to start the registration process.

E-registration can be completed online on any computer starting **July 28** at: **http://midland.powerschool.com/public** After logging into your parent PowerSchool account, click on **FORMS** and complete all registration forms as applicable labeled 1-8 for each student.

If you need one-on-one help completing eregistration, call 319-259-5340 for an onsite e-registration appointment in Wyoming on Tuesday, July 29 from 10am-6pm or in Oxford Junction by appt.

Both school offices are generally open during summer Mon-Fri from 8am-3pm to drop off payments cash or check or they can be mailed to MCSD, PO Box 109, Wyoming, IA 52362.

- 1. Please be sure to use the child's complete legal name when entering it in PowerSchool. These will go on all records at school, it is important to have the correct name on their transcript when they leave high school. Please include both your street AND mailing address. **CAREFULLY COMPLETE THE CONTACT SECTION!** We need correct info to be sure you receive all mailings sent to you during the year. Be sure to sort parents in the sequential order that you want to be called in contacts. Also please be sure to **include emergency name(s) and phone number(s), this must be someone OTHER than the parent**, someone we can contact if we cannot contact you in case of emergency. We always try parents first, but cannot always contact you when needed.
- 2. All fees are to be paid at registration or mailed in prior to the beginning of school. We need separate checks for textbook rent, school lunches and athletic passes. We **STRONGLY ENCOURAGE all families to complete a lunch application form** which includes the waiver of fees application form, this form affects more things than your child's lunch status it opens other doors for the district in a variety of ways. We want everyone who qualifies to receive the benefits available.
- 3. Lunch/breakfast money should be sent to school by August 15th so the money gets into your child's account and is ready to use on the first day. Students will have a lunch account number assigned through PowerSchool.

All families are encouraged to fill out an Iowa Free and Reduced Price meal application to determine your status. A hard copy of the application will be mailed to all addresses later in July, can be found on our website at https://www.midland.k12.ia.us/district-info/food-and-nutrition/ or you can pick one up at any time during the school year from either school office.

A new form can be submitted at any time throughout the year if you have a change of income.

Free and reduced price meal recipients must apply each year to qualify, see below for eligibility guidelines. This benefit helps not only with school meals but with school registration fees and helps our district in other ways as well, so we encourage everyone to fill one out each year.

Application forms should be completely filled out and turned in BEFORE school starts.

Completed applications are accepted at either school office and must be approved before they can be valid for the student.

PLEASE do not wait until Open House or the first day of school to submit this application as it does take some time to get the eligibility figured and approved.

WHEN QUESTIONS ARISE, WHERE SHOULD ONE GO FOR ANSWERS?

Communication between the community and the Midland Community School District is a high priority. Questions and concerns from our public need to be heard and addressed. District patrons often wonder who they should talk to when a question or concern arises. This school district has a chain of command process to handle the issues citizens bring to the district. However, if doubts ever exist about the correct starting point for a particular question or concern, contact the Superintendent's office. The following is the district's chain of command flowchart:

Academic, Transportation, and Food Service Questions

Teacher, Initial Stage: Questions or concerns regarding instructional practices in your child's classroom first should be directed to the teacher.

- ·Transportation, Initial Stage: Questions about transportation for your child first should be directed to the Transportation Director John Stender at the Wyoming center.
- ·Food Service, Initial Stage: Questions or concerns regarding the breakfast or lunch programs should be directed to the food service contact, Erika Tubbs at the Oxford Junction center.
 - ·Building Principal, Second Stage: If more information is needed or you still have questions or concerns, schedule a discussion with your child's principal Elementary Deanna Martens and Middle/High School Bobby Willms.
- ·Superintendent, Third Stage: A conference with Superintendent Doug Koeperich is most appropriate when questions or concerns have not been adequately addressed at earlier stages.
- ·Board of Education, Final Stage: The last level of contact with the district about a question or concern is the board of education.
- Activity Programs Questions: When questions or concerns exist having to do with an activity that your child is participating in outside the school day the proper chain of command progresses similarly to what is stated above.

The exact procedures of who to contact are the following:

1) Coach/ Sponsor

2) Activities Director

- 3) Building Principal
- 4) Superintendent
- 5) Board of Education.

DISTRICT NEWSLETTER INFORMATION

INSURANCE: The School District's insurance policy does not cover injuries incurred by your child at school.

We encourage all families to have accident coverage on their children prior to participating in any sports or school sponsored activity. Student Assurances provides coverage with low premiums.

Annual Student Records Notice

Midland Schools maintains records on each student served in order to facilitate the instruction, guidance and educational progress of the student. The records of each student are generally located in their most recent attendance center. The Midland policy on student records can be secured upon request, or online at https://www.midland.k12.ia.us/wp-content/uploades/2021/04/Notifi.StudentRecordsAccess.pdf

Student records are reviewed and inappropriate material removed periodically. Those records not of permanent importance are destroyed, if not accessed within the previous five calendar years, or at the student's attained age of 21 years. Authorized persons wishing to review purged records prior to destruction must contact the records technician prior to May 30, 2026 at Midland High School, 106 W Webster Street, Wyoming, IA 52362 or call 319-259-5340 ext 1250.

Students over age 18 and parents of students under the age of 18 may exercise the opportunity to review educational records of the student or to obtain copies of the records.

TRANSPORTATION NEWS

Dear Parent:

Below you will find some basic rules for students riding buses. This list does not pretend to cover each and every possible prohibited behavior. Common sense must still be the determining factor in the safety of our students while riding the buses. It would be helpful to us if you would go over these rules with your children, and try to stress the importance of their cooperation with the bus driver.

Driving a bus in a safe manner takes all the attention of the driver. The rules are not to punish students for misbehaving, but to allow the driver to drive without distractions. Good conduct on the part of the riders will help the driver do his/her job of safely driving the bus.

MIDLAND COMMUNITY SCHOOL BUS RULES

GENERAL

- 1. Please obey the bus driver. He/she is responsible for both the students and the safe handling of the bus.
- 2. When being picked up on a route, please be ready to board the bus when it arrives. Buses are not required to wait for late students. The buses run on a tight schedule, and waiting at one stop causes inconvenience all the way down the line.
- 3. Conversation with the driver when the bus is in motion could be distracting. When the bus is in motion, speak to the driver only if absolutely necessary.
- 4. Common sense dictates that there are many substances and articles that should not be taken on a bus. Some of the obvious ones are alcoholic beverages, tobacco, any controlled substance, matches, lighters, glass containers, and non-human critters in any form. If in doubt about what is acceptable, call your bus driver ahead of time.
- 5. All except the youngest students know what is acceptable behavior in a contained area such as a class room or a bus. "Horseplay" often gets out of hand, and can result in injury, or if it distracts the driver, many injuries.
- 6. For your own safety, please keep hands, feet, and other body parts inside the bus. Nothing is to be extended or thrown from the bus. Remember, your school's name is on the side of the bus, and any littering is a reflection on the whole student body.

BOARDING AND/OR LEAVING THE BUS

- 1. Students are to enter and leave the bus at the right front entrance. If they are to cross a traveled roadway, they should wait until they are signaled to cross by the bus driver and pass in front of the bus.
- 2. While waiting for a bus, please do not move toward the bus until it has come to a complete stop.
- 3. While on the bus, students are to remain seated until the bus has come to a complete stop.
- 4. If a student is to be dropped off at a place other than the regular school or home bus stop, he/she must have a written request from a parent. The student's teacher or principal should also be notified. This will save us from losing someone.

IMPORTANT MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Before School starts in August all kindergarten, 7th and 12th grade students must have their respective immunizations per state law.

All Kindergarten and 9th grade students must have a current **Dental screening certificate** on file.

All information and required forms can be found at https://www.midland.k12.ia.us/district-info/health-services/

All Kindergarten students must submit an up to date immunization record showing proof of having received all 4 year old boosters; Dtap, Polio, MMR and Varicella. All Kindergarten students must also submit a current dental certificate (signed in the past 12 months).

All 7th grade (and above) students must show proof of having received a Tdap (Tetanus/Acellular Pertussis) vaccination booster AND a Meningococcal vaccination on or after 10 years of age.

All 9th grade students must submit a dental certificate signed by a dental health professional showing proof of a dental screening in the last 12 months (after August 2020)

All 12th grade students must show proof of receiving 2 DOSES of Meningococcal vaccine; or 1 dose if first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.

We want to make you aware of an important update regarding student cell phone and electronic device use during instructional time.

<u>Iowa state law</u> prohibits the use of cell phones and other electronic devices, including Smart Watches, during instructional periods. Our school

is currently developing a school board policy to implement this law effectively at Midland. To ensure clarity and consistency, the following consequences will apply for violations of this policy:



Changes in legislation

- **1st Offense**: Device sent to the office; student may pick it up at the end of the school day.
- **2nd Offense**: Device sent to the office; student may pick it up at the end of the school day; 60-minute detention assigned.
- **3rd Offense**: Device sent to the office; parent must pick it up at the end of the school day; 60-minute detention assigned.
- **4th Offense**: Parent meeting with the principal required; possible cell phone ban for the remainder of the school year.

This policy also applies to students enrolled in Kirkwood online courses during the school day.

Please take time to discuss this state law and school expectation with your child(ren) so they understand the importance of complying with these rules. Our goal is to create an environment focused on learning and success for every student.

ATTENDANCE:

Communication between parent and school regarding attendance is VERY IMPORANT! If you know your student will be absent from school beforehand, please call, email the office or send a note. If a student is absent unexpectedly, please call the office by 8:30AM if possible 319-259-5340 ext 9 for Wyo or ext 6 for OJ, this message center is open 24 hours a day seven days a week. If you cannot call, please send a note with your child when he/she returns to school.

Parents should read the Family Handbook for specific attendance rules for each building. At the Wyoming center students are expected to know and follow the attendance rules, just like you would at your job. Our attendance rules for students closely mirror those for staff members as we are trying to get kids ready for life in the real world. If you have questions, please ask.

Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a
 bully or facing some other difficulty.
- · By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Make school attendance a priority

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- · Help your children maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and non-urgent related medical appointments during the school day.
- Keep your student healthy. If you are concerned about about a contagious illness, call your school or health care provider.
- If your children must stay home because they are sick, make sure they have asked teachers for resources and materials to
 make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

Help your teen stay engaged

- · Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your teens are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor you teen's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- · Encourage your child to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- Support your students if you notice signs of anxiety, and if needed, seek advice from your school or health provider

Communicate with the school

- Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties.
- Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.
- Seek help from school staff, other parents, or community agencies if you need support.

ATHLETIC PHYSICAL REMINDER

Middle school and high school athletes are reminded to get your athletic physical BEFORE the first practice of your sports season. Athletes must have a current physical form AND a concussion form on file in BOUND before being allowed to participate in practices or games. Physicals are valid for 13 months from completion date.

Remember that a doctor AND a parent must each sign the form for it to be valid, if turned in incomplete the student will not be allowed to participate until completed.
